The Telecommunications Regulatory Commission publishes Consumer Cybersecurity Guidelines

21 March, 2017 the Telecommunications Regulatory Commission published guidelines for consumers in relation to cybersecurity. This is a part of the Commission commitment to promote citizen and consumer awareness of the safe use of the internet and mobile devices, and privacy of personal data.

One of the challenges faced worldwide, including in the Virgin Islands, relates to the unauthorised access and use of personal data.
